Based on a book by Cressida Cowell, How to Train Your Dragon is a movie about a scrawny, weak Viking boy named Hiccup who doesn't fit in with the rest of the adolescent Vikings who have names like Ruffnut, Tuffnut, and Snotlout. Hiccup is too little and too different from the other teenagers. They are all sent on a test where they have to capture and train a dragon. The toughest Viking in the group is a girl named Astrid. She is not in the book at all, but they added her into the movie because they thought it would be fun to have a girl character who is just as strong as the boy Vikings.

In an interview, America Ferrera, the actress who voices the character of Astrid, talks about the movie and what it was like to play her part.



What is your favorite thing about Astrid?

America Ferrera: I loved Astrid because she was ready to fight with the boys and play with those dragons. I think it's good that the movie never really makes a big deal out of it; that's just how it is. She is the best young fighting dragon player and nobody ever says, "You're a girl, so it's ridiculous that you are a fighter."

I think that Astrid was a new kind of character for me to play, because she was so tough. And actually, in the beginning of the movie you think that she will be the hero. Because she's smart and she is prepared and she is physically trained and everyone thinks she is the star Viking. Her most important moment in the movie comes when she realizes that she is not going to be the hero, and she encourages Hiccup to go and be the hero instead. I think that makes her a hero in a different way.

Do you think Astrid's character has a message for girls?

America Ferrera: Totally! I think just having her in this movie sends a message to the audience, because she isn't cooking or knitting. Back in the Viking times, women were not Vikings, so the movie is not even historically correct. But it's really wonderful that Astrid is in the movie and that she wants to be the best and to be famous as the biggest Viking dragon player there ever was. It's good that in the movie, we don't ever talk about it like it's a bad thing. Girls watching this movie love an adrenaline rush and an adventure action movie as much as any boy does. I know I do. I think we'll be really inspired by a strong girl character who thinks that she can be just as good as any of the guys.
